

Program objectives:

Coordinate key private sector security personnel with public sector first responders in protecting critical infrastructure, high profile targets, and key county assets.

Partner with public safety agencies to implement interdiction policies and target hardening strategies, striving to ensure a unified, consistent, and coordinated response to terrorism.

Improve and expedite information sharing between private sector business partners and the law enforcement community.

Provide networking forum, information sharing, training opportunities and dissemination of Threat Advisories and open source Intel Bulletins.

Improve virtual reach back capability within the Operational Area during time of crisis ensuring access to necessary resources and field intelligence.

Promote mitigation, preparedness and response plans supporting efforts to reconstitute economic viability for Orange County in the aftermath of any man made or natural disaster.



Situational Awareness:

- ◆ Take note of your surroundings.
- ◆ Know the routine of your business area, home and community.
- ◆ Look out for unusual conduct or behavior.
- ◆ Be aware of suspicious objects, packages or vehicles in your area.
- ◆ If you hear a threat by someone that could be credible, take it seriously and report it.
